International Incoming Fellowships (IIF)

The International Incoming Fellowship aims at attracting top-notch researchers active in third countries (e.g. USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, India, etc.) and makes them do research in an EU Member State or Associated country. IIF aims at encouraging researchers to plan their period of international mobility within a coherent research project and thus enhances possible future long-lasting collaborations. Alike to the other Marie Curie Actions, the IIF follows a bottom-up approach, i.e. the research project is chosen freely by the applicant in cooperation with his/her supervisor at the host organisation.

Proposal preparation:

- Eligible researchers, in cooperation with their host organisation (university, independent research institution, industry, etc.) in an EU Member State or Associated country and the return host organisation in a third country (if applicable)
- Contracts will be signed between the European Commission and the host organisation. In case of a return-phase, the return host organisation will be included in the proposal preparation

Eligible Researchers:

- Experienced researchers in possession of a PhD or with at least 4 years of research experience full time
- Applicants can be of any nationality and must comply with the mobility rule: they must move from a third country to an EU Member State or Associated country
- Researchers currently working in a third country but who have been active as researchers in Europe beforehand are eligible for an IEF

FUNDING

Contribution to the researcher:

Contribution to the host organisation:

Overheads*	Flat rate of €700/month
For a possible return phase**	€15.000/year for maximum 1 year
