ATLANTIS Background



- New (3rd) agreement on higher education and vocational training (signed on 21 June 2006 at the EU-U.S. Summit)
- Programme duration 2006 2013
- renews and reinforce the long standing EU-U.S. cooperation programme established in 1995
- funded and managed jointly by the European Commission and by the U.S. Department of Education
- to promote understanding between the peoples of the EU and the USA and to improve the quality of their human resource development








EU-U.S. Agreement foresees 4 main actions:

- Action 1 Transatlantic Degree Consortia Projects
- Action 2 Excellence (Follow-up) Mobility Projects
- Action 3 Policy-oriented Measures
- Action 4 Schuman-Fulbright-Programme providing scholarships



ATLANTIS within EU-U.S. Agreement











- ATLANTIS Actions for Transatlantic Links and Academic Networks in Training and Integrated Studies
- 1st call for proposals in the framework of the EU-US cooperation programme in higher education and vocational training
- 1st call comprises Action 1 and Action 3
- Available budget for 2006
 - approx. 4 million € for EU institutions for a 4-years project period
 - comparable funding for U.S. institutions
- The 2006 joint EU-US call for proposals is closed (deadline 7 July 2006)







Countries:

- U.S.A.
- 25 EU Member States

Individuals (students, faculty):

- EU citizens or legal residents in the EU for at least 3 years (for purpose other than study)
- U.S. citizens or resident aliens

Establishments/bodies/type of beneficiaries:

- higher education institutions
- vocational education and training institutions
- Organisations including industry, business groups, NGOs, publishers, government departments, chambers of commerce and research institutions







Atlantis Consortia = 3 = EU1+EU2+US

- → min. 2 HE / VET institutions or organisations from 2 different EU-member states
- → min. 1 HE / VET institution or organisation from the U.S.A.
- → 2 applications forms to be submitted for 1 common project proposal (FIPSE, DG EAC)

Transatlantic Degree Consortia Projects

Who?

 At least 2 EU and 1 U.S. higher education institutions form a consortium

What?

- Transatlantic Degree awarded by at least 1 EU and 1 US institution
- Joint Study Programme including mobility
- Undergraduate level

Duration?

- Project selected for 4 years
- Annual performance reviews

Transatlantic Degree Consortia Projects

Joint Study Programme

- Integrated programme of study
 - → Jointly developed curriculum
 - → or full recognition of modules that make up a common study programme
- Duration
 - → Total study programme duration
 - → Duration of mobility phases
- Integrated admission standards
 - → Collaborative selection process that meets standards of each partner institution
 - → Shared application procedure or accepted institutional application procedures
 - → Shared admission standards



ATLANTIS 1st Call - Action 1



Joint Study Programme

- Examination and progression (transfer) requirements
 - → Full and automatic recognition of examinations passed at partner institutions
 - → Use of ECTS is recommended
- Mobility
 - → Students study at least at 3 institutions (2 EU, 1 U.S.)
 - → At least 1 full academic year abroad
- Degree Award
 - → Recognised joint or double degree
 - → Awarded by at least 1 U.S.-institution and 1 EU-institution
- Language requirements
 - → provide the possibility of using at least two European languages
 - → Only one language of instruction possible
 - → Language and cultural preparation and training is essential



ATLANTIS 1st Call - Action 1



Student Mobility Scheme

- U.S. students
 - → at 2 EU institutions
 - → at least 60 ECTS in total (1 academic year)
 - → at least 20 ECTS at the second EU institution
- EU students
 - → at least 1 institution in the U.S.
 - → at least 20 ECTS at an additional EU institution
 - → At least 60 ECTS in total (1 academic year)
- Curriculum may involve work or training experience
- Credits
 - → Agreed arrangements must be described in the application
- Tuition and fees
 - → Agreed arrangements must be described in the application
- Student services provided







Faculty Mobility Scheme

- Teaching and Research assignments related to programme
 - → Mobility grants/ Mobility stipends

- Mobility of administrators is welcome
 - → Fixed administrative costs in the U.S. budget
 - → Flat rate in the EU budget

What? – Projects may include:

- Studies
- Seminars
- Working groups
- Benchmarking exercises
- Recognition of qualifications
- Accreditation issues
- Comparative studies and analysis
- Language and content integration
- Dissemination of projects
- Software and Web development
- E-learning and open education
- Infrastructure and resources development







Mobility

- No student mobility
- May include faculty and staff exchanges

Project duration

max. 2 years







Project Design

- Nature and purpose of project
- Role and skills of the partners
- Description of activities and expected results
- Personnel involved
- How the project will enhance understanding, increase knowledge

Evaluation

- Define goals
- Evaluation plan based on quantitative and qualitative evidence

Dissemination

- Strategies for sustainability
- Dissemination of products, outcomes and results to a wider public

max. 75% of the project costs incurred by the EU side	All budget line items except students stipends
Max. € 50,000 for 2 years	Max. of \$ 50,000 for 2 years
