### **Revised FP7 model grant agreement (draft)**

#### **ANNEX II. GENERAL CONDITIONS**

Article II.3 is modified as follows:

"Each beneficiary shall:


o) designate a legal entity appointed representative (LEAR) as the authorised person to perform the role and tasks stipulated in its document of appointment. If a LEAR has already been appointed the beneficiary agrees that the role and tasks of this LEAR are replaced by those stipulated in the document of appointment in force on the date of signature of this grant agreement."

Point 5 of Article II.4 is replaced by the following:

"The consortium shall transmit the reports and other deliverables through the coordinator to the Commission using the electronic exchange system set up by the Commission. In particular:

- Form C must be transmitted and electronically signed through the electronic exchange system by the authorised person(s) within the *beneficiary*'s organisation.
- The certificates on the financial statements and on the methodology must be handsigned by an authorised person of the auditing entity on paper and the *beneficiary* shall keep the originals according to Article II.22.3. A scanned copy of the certificates shall be transmitted through the electronic exchange system".

## New role in the identity and access management

- New role in the identity and access management: persons authorised to sign forms C for their organisation (FSIGN)
- Nominations for this new role by LEARs
   (or their account administrators) under the "organisation roles" function
- Unlimited number of FSIGNs can be nominated
- LEARs can add comments to each FSIGN (e.g. which part of the forms C of the organisation they can sign)
- Comments are visible to the persons having project roles in the organisation (Participant Contacts (PaCos) etc.)



## **Process of electronic-only submission**

- Participant contact assigns an FSIGN to the project (from the list nominated by the LEAR)
- Participant contact or task manager prepares form C (as today)
- If applicable, participant contact or task manager uploads scanned copy of certificate on financial statement (signed by the auditor), original to be kept in the files of the beneficiary
- When ready, participant contact identifies form C as "ready for signature", triggering a notification to the FSIGN
- FSIGN electronically signs and submits form C to the coordinator
- After submission by the coordinator of the forms C package to the Commission, a digitally signed eReceipt is issued for each form C
- No more paper signature of forms C, no more paper sending of certificates on financial statements





## **Retroactiveness?**

- New regime is obligatory for all grants signed after 1.1.2013 (changed model grant agreement)
- Consequence: nomination of LEARs will become obligatory
- For grants signed before 1.1.2013, the current parallel paper and electronic submission will remain available as an option
- However: consortia are encouraged to go for the electroniconly also for existing grants
- Pre-requisite: signature of a simple amendment (accepting the new stipulations of the revised model grant agreement)
- Template for requesting this amendment will be made available



#### FP7 Quick info for National Contact Points November 2012

#### No more signed paper financial statements (forms C)

Paperless FP7 grant management comes closer; the paperless submission of financial statements (forms C) will start on 1 January 2013.

#### New process

- Organisations have to identify the persons authorised to sign forms C. For this, a new role, the Financial Statement Authorised Signatory (FSIGN) is introduced in the identity and access management (IAM) of the Participant Portal [hyperlink]. FSIGNs are nominated by the Legal Entity Appointed Representative (LEAR), online directly in the portal (see revised model grant agreement [hyperlink] and new LEAR mandate [hyperlink]). The nomination of a LEAR for each participating organisation becomes thus mandatory. LEARs can register an unlimited number of FSIGNs for their organisation, can add comments to each name and can revoke or replace them at any time. Account Administrators (nominated by LEARs and having delegated powers from the LEAR) can do the same. Nominations are made in the role management screen under "My organisations".
- The participant contact (PaCo) for a particular project chooses a FSIGN for the project from the list nominated by the LEAR. This is done in the role management screen of the project.
- When a periodic report is due, after the financial data are introduced in the financial reporting module, PaCos identify a form C as "ready for signature" (instead of submitting directly to the coordinator as currently). This triggers a notification to the



## Single submission of periodic reports



## Single submission of periodic report

- Grant agreement: periodic report is one package, comprising scientific, administrative and financial aspects; comprising contributions of all partners
- Current practice: bits and pieces come in separately (scientific part, forms C)
- Future practice: electronic-only submission of the full package in one go by the coordinator when deemed complete; "dossier" in the reporting module of the PP
- No subsequent delivery, e.g. of forms C for partners being late – anything missing at the time of single submission goes to next reporting period
- Advantages: clarity, more transparent handling of the clock for time-to-pay; incentive for "latecomers"
