Two objectives for all European regions:

Strengthen their capacity for investing in RTD and carrying out research activities

Produce research strategies that contribute to regional economic development

Through the development of regional 'research-driven clusters'



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4. Research Potential

Two objectives for EU's convergence and outermost (RUP) regions

Unlock and develop their research capacities

Foster an increase in their participation to Community research activities

To fully realise the European Research Area in the enlarged Union

Through:

- > Transnational two-way secondments and recruitment of staff
- > Development of research equipment and the material environment
- > Workshops and conferences for knowledge transfer
- > 'Evaluation facilities'

5. Science in Society

- Strengthening the European science system (inc. scientific advice)
- · Broader public engagement on science-related questions
- Promoting better science through ethics research and ethical review
- Science and technology and their place in society
- Gender research, gender dimension, and the role of women in research
- Science education curiosity and the participation of young people
- · Policy for the role and engagement of universities
- Communication between scientists, policy-makers, media and the public



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6. Coherent Development of Research Policies

- Monitoring and analysis of research related public policies/industrial strategies:
 - Information and intelligence service (ERAWATCH)
 - Industrial research investment monitoring
 - Indicators on research activity and its impact on the economy
- · Coordination of research policies:
 - Implementing the Open Method of Coordination
 - Bottom-up initiatives undertaken by several countries and regions (OMC-NET)

7. Activities of International Cooperation

Two interdependent objectives:

Support competitiveness through strategic partnerships with third countries in selected fields Address specific problems that third countries face or that have a global character, on the basis of mutual interest and mutual benefit

'Horizontal' support actions and measures not carried out in the Cooperation or People programmes



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I – Before Regions of Knowledge

- Pilot Action in 2003
 - ✓ <u>Objective</u>: implementing the Lisbon strategy at regional level, stressing the central role of knowledge for regional development
 - ✓ <u>Instrument</u>: networks of european regions, including universities, research entities and enterprises.
 - √14 projects financed for € 2,5 M
- · Call for proposal in 2004
 - ✓ <u>Objective</u>: promote more and better regional investments in research
 - ✓ <u>Instrument</u>: mutual learning, coordination and collaboration between regional policies and initiatives through foresight, benchmarking, networking and coordination activities
 - √18 projects financed for € 9 M







I – Regions of Knowledge – Policy Context

The "Regions of Knowledge" initiative responds to a need to increase the overall capacity of regional players to enhance science and technology for economic development of all European Regions

Expected Outcome

- improve links between stakeholders and local business community
- * foster transnational / cross-border cooperation
- enhance mutual learning of regional actors
- * exchange experience and best practice



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I - Regions of Knowledge

Two objectives for all European regions:


Strengthen their capacity for investing in RTD and carrying out research activities


Produce research strategies that contribute to regional economic development

Through the development of regional 'research-driven clusters'

Associated and candidate countries are also eligible











I - Expected impact

- Regional economical growth in selected domains
- Response to the needs of regional business communities
- Mobilisation of local, national and community funds to implement defined regional "action plans"



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EUROPEAN RESEARCH AREA

I - FP7 and the Structural Funds: more synergies

- FP 7 has a new regional dimension, under "Capacities"
- ... while Structural Funds will reinforce R&D investment
 - R&D, innovation and entrepreneurship as the first priority in Convergence regions
 - Innovation and the knowledge economy as the first priority for the competitiveness and growth objective
 - Earmarking: at least 60% or 75% of funds for Lisbon priorities
- Complementary funding where possible
 - ... but no double funding







I – RoK: Main activities 2007

Three calls for a total of 10 M €:

• **REGIONS-2007-1** (8.8 M €)

Analysis, mentoring and integration of research actors

• **REGIONS-2007-2** (0.8 m €)

Facilitating the emergence of **new clusters** and mutual information

• **REGIONS-2007-3** (0.4 M €)

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I - Thematic priorities in 2007

For the first two calls:

1. Bringing the benefits of research to SMEs

Action aimed at increasing integration of SMEs in regional research driven clusters and awareness about the potential benefits of research for SMEs in their business activities.

2. Research and rural economies

Action aimed at integration of economic actors into regional research driven clusters as a key challenge to allow the development of dynamic rural and maritime knowledge economies.





I – REGIONS-2007-1



Supporting analysis, mentoring and integration of research actors

Activities

- Analysis, development and implementation of research agendas
- Mentoring of regions with a less developed research profile or mutual learning
- Initiatives to improve integration: definition of joint action plans, together with business plans – following SWOT analysis and definition of RTD needs
- Dissemination activities

Participants

- Consortia of regional research driven clusters
- or a single transnational regional research driven cluster
 - ... and always at least 6 partners from 2 countries

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I - REGIONS-2007-2



Facilitating the emergence of new clusters and mutual information

Activities

- creation of new research driven clusters
- Analysis, workshops, roundtables, expert group meetings, dissemination activities, including web-based initiatives

Participants

• at least 3 participants (one research entity, one public authority, one enterprise) or one research driven cluster (for mutual information activities)





I - REGIONS-2007-3



Transnational cooperation among NCPs

Activities

- Reinforcing the network of National Contact Points (NCP) by focussing on identifying and sharing good practices (benchmarking, joint workshops, training, and twinning schemes, trans-national brokerage events)
- **Specific approach** to be adapted to the nature of the theme, capacities and priorities of the NCPs concerned
- Special attention to helping less experienced NCPs
- Proposals to include all officially appointed NCPs
- Action to involve official FP7 contacts from Associated Countries.



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I - Instruments



Projects will be implemented through:

Coordination and support Actions (CSAs).

- Coordination actions promote the creation of added value by bringing together on-going activities in a given field in different countries and providing them with a European dimension.
- → For REGIONS-2007-03
- > Support actions will be used to provide support to promote systematic mutual information exchange and joint activities (analysis, workshops, roundtables, expert group meetings, mentoring, dissemination activities)
- → For REGIONS-2007-01 and REGIONS-2007-02

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II - RESEARCH POTENTIAL

Two objectives for **CONVERGENCE & OUTERMOST** regions only:

- to stimulate the realisation of the full research potential by unlocking and developing the research potential in the EU's convergence regions and outermost regions
- to strengthen the capacities of their researchers to success fully participate in research activities at EU level

CONVERGENCE REGIONS

Regions eligible for financing by the Structural Funds (2007-2013) under objective « convergence »

i.e. Sicilia (IT), Castilla la Mancha (ES), Martinique (FR), MT, Calabria (IT), Baltic states...

OUTERMOST REGIONS:

Regions defined by art. 299§2 of EC Treaty

i.e. Canary Islands (ES), 4 DOM (FR), Açores & Madère (PT)

DOM = Guadeloupe, Guyane, Martinique, Réunion

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EUROPEAN RESEARCH AREA

Activities

- Exchange of know-how and experience through trans-national two-way secondments of research staff with another EU state
- Recruitment of incoming experienced researchers
- Acquisition, development or upgrading of research equipment for the selected centres
- Organisation of workshops and conferences to facilitate knowledge transfer at (inter-)national level
- Dissemination and promotional activities



II - Expected impact

OPTIMISATION of:

- International exposure and recognition
- Leadership potential
- Quality of their scientists
- Visibility of their research groups

INCREASE of:

- Visibility of their research groups
- Participation in the ERA/FP

REGPOT-2007-1 (23.5 M€)

Unlocking and developing the research potential in the EU's convergence and outermost regions

REGPOT-2007-2 (1 M€) Providing **evaluation facilities** for research organisations in the EU's convergence and outermost regions

International cooperation focused on Western Balkan Countries

II - REGPOT-2007-1

Unlocking and developing the research potential in the EU's convergence and outermost regions

Participants

Any existing and autonomous public or private **research entity** in the eligible regions

Expected output

Action plan to upgrade excellence centre through a mix of foreseen eligible activities



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II - REGPOT-2007-2

Providing **evaluation facilities** for research organisations in the EU's convergence and outermost regions

Activities

- Evaluation of research quality and infrastructures by high level independent experts (SWOT analysis)
- Preparation of an Action Plan to upgrade and reinforce its RTD potential by the selected centre

Participants

Public or private **research centre** in the EU's **convergence regions** and **outermost regions**





II - REGPOT-2007-3



International Cooperation focused on Western Balkan Countries

Objectives

To promote closer S&T cooperation opportunities between European Union and in particular its convergence regions and the Western Balkan Countries (WBC) - through a mix of foreseen eligible activities.

Participants

Proposals should include at least **3 participants**: one from a *convergence or outermost region* in the EU, one from a *Member State* or an *associated country* and at least one from a *WBC*

Transnational cooperation among NCPs

Activities

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- Specific approach to be adapted to the nature of the theme, capacities and priorities of the NCPs concerned
- special attention to helping less experienced NCPs
- proposals to include all officially appointed NCPs

II - Instruments



Projects will be implemented through Coordination and support Actions (CSAs).

- **Coordination actions** promote the creation of added value by bringing together on-going activities in a given field in different countries and providing them with a European dimension.
- → For REGPOT-2007-04
- >Support actions will be used to provide support to foster seed-beds to create new research-driven clusters and to promote systematic mutual information exchange (analysis, workshops, roundtables, expert group meetings, dissemination activities)

- Timetable of procedure
 - ✓ Calls for proposals published 22/12/2006
 - ✓ Deadline for submission: 24/4/2007
 - ✓ Selection, with help of independent experts within 3 months of call closure (24/7/2007)
 - ✓ Negotiation phase
 - ✓ Commission decision
 - ✓ Signature of grant agreement and entry into force, if possible before year end



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- · Reminder: eligibility criteria, especially for
 - ✓ Cluster composition (number and type of entities)
 - ✓ Geographical location
- Selection and award criteria (see RP art. 15, 16, 38):
 - √ Financial capacity
 - ✓ Scientific and technological excellence
 - ✓ Relevance to the objectives of the work programme
 - ✓ Potential impact through the development, dissemination and use of project results
 - ✓ Quality and efficiency of the implementation and management



Implementation



- Role of coordinator (see art. 25-36 PR):
 - ✓ Monitor compliance with obligations by partners, including formalities for accession
 - ✓ Receive and distribute Community grant without undue delay
 - ✓ Keep records and financial accounts for the grant implementation
 - ✓ Intermediary for efficient coordination with Commission
- Financial issues (see art. 30 & sq RP):
 - √ Reimbursement of eligible costs
 - ✓ Audit certificate requested if payments > 375 000 € per partner
 - ✓ Financial responsibility of each partner limited to its own debt
 - ✓ Participant guarantee fund
- Model contract consortium agreement never compulsory
