The objective of the ERA2009 conference is to look at the Role of Basic Research in the Process of Structuring the European Research Area (ERA). The event is being organized by the Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic, under the auspices of the Czech Presidency of the Council of the European Union.

The formation of the ERA is a political goal draw-up by the European Union at the beginning of the XXI century. The vision is being refined periodically through various analysis and/or recommendations, e.g. the Commission's Green Paper on "The ERA: New Perspectives" or Council conclusions. The ERA2009 conference will contribute to the discussion on these new perspectives for the European Research Area. The target participants are from the European and international communities of research stakeholders, research performing organizations, science foundations, European Commission and other relevant policy makers. The scientific community and relevant policy makers of all the EU member states as well as of the associated states are invited to come into the debate.
